IMPORTANT EVENT INFORMATION

ENTRIES CLOSE: 3RD AUGUST 2013

- •Late entries and change of classes will incur a \$5 surcharge per class which will be strictly adhered to. Late entries will be added to top of the draw.
- •No entries will be accepted unless accompanied by the correct entry fee, camping/stabling fee and EFA numbers.
- •No telephone entries accepted.
- •Refund of entries will be given for scratching made before 6:00pm Wednesday 7th August 2013. Thereafter, a veterinary or doctors certificate must be produced to claim refund.

RULES

- The FEI Rules for Jumping and EA Addendum to the Rules will apply.
- All horses in Ring 1 must be currently registered and hold current performance cards with the EA
- All riders must be members of the ACT Showjumping Club or Equestrian Australia.
- Australian helmet standards will apply. All riders must wear approved boots and helmet whilst mounted, including presentations, training, before and after the event.
- All dogs must be tied up or on leads and secured at all times. No dogs are allowed onto the competition arena or practice arenas at any time.
- All riders competing at this event will be expected to have read these rules and conditions and accept and acknowledge the wavier forms signed with the EA.
- NO ABUSE OF OFFICIALS OR VOLUNTEERS WILL BE TOLERATED. Failure to follow instruction from the Organizing Committee members will result in disqualification from the event.
- Ring 1 is for senior riders only, with the exception of classes 5 & 20. A 'senior' is a rider over the age of 18 years on the date of competition.
- Ring 2 is for junior riders only. A 'Junior' is a rider aged 18 years or younger on the date of competition. Junior's may not compete in senior classes and vice versa. 'Open' classes are for riders of any age.
- •Class 3B (amateur) will be run under the Australian Amateur ruling, as outlined in the Amateur showjumer of the Year Series information below. This class does *not* count towards the Jumping NSW Amateur Showjumper of the Year Series.
- Class 18B will count towards the Jumping NSW 2013 Amateur Showjumper of the Year Series, and be run under the Australian Amateur ruling, as outlined in the information below.
- Horses entered in class 3a may not compete in class 3b. Horses entered in class 18a may not compete in 18b.

CAMPING & HORSE LEVY

- Equestrian Park is being hired for the event and is available for camping from Friday 9th August 2013.
- •The minimum camping fee is \$20 per horse carrying vehicle, which will cover up to three (3) nights.
- Camping fees/horse levy must accompany entries.
- A horse levy of \$4 per horse is charged. Revenue goes to Park maintenance.
- There are no showers or powered sites on the grounds

YARDS

- A limited number of open yards are available for \$20 per horse for the duration of the show.
- •Temporary fencing is allowed in areas allocated. This costs \$5 per horse & must be paid for with entries.
- Yard fees must accompany entries.

RAFFLE

A raffle will be available to enter throughout the weekend, in order to raise funds for the club.

Raffle is donated by Barastoc & Emmaville Performance Horses, to the value of over \$200.

Tickets are \$2 each, or 3 for \$5. The raffle will be drawn at 2pm Sunday.

MASTERS PLATE.

- The spirit of the event is to create a competition for our mature aged riders who have not or no longer compete in the main rings at heights higher than 80 cm at events. Our aim is to encourage these riders to continue riding, take it up again or start riding
- The prize will be a perpetual trophy engraved with the annual winners name & horse (kept in the club house), and trophy to the winner.

RULES OF THE COMPETITION:

- The event will run over 2 competitions:
 - i The Canberra Classic (August)
 - ii. The Canberra Showjumping Cup (October)
- Heights will consist of X-rails up to 80cm (ring 3)
- Points will be awarded from best 2 rounds:
 - \circ 1st = 5 points, 2nd = 4 points, 3rd = 3 points, 4th = 2 points, 5th = 1 point
- Horse or rider cannot compete in ring 1 or 2 at the same event
- For riders aged 40 plus

JUMPING NSW - 2013 AMATEUR SHOWJUMPER OF THE YEAR SERIES.

Jumping NSW will again be hosting the Amateur Jumping Series throughout 2013.

ABOUT THE SERIES:

- An annual series of shows hosting qualifying events will run throughout the calendar year in NSW.
- The horse/rider's six best performances will decide the series winner.
- Scores will be based on a Horse/rider combination.
- Class heights in the first round might range between 1.15m to 1.20m depending on the type of arena, and the standard of the show. Indoor arenas can be first round 1.10m. This should be stated on the show schedules.
- Participants must meet the criteria of the National Amateur Ruling.
- All events will be AM5 Art. 238 2.2 (Jump off classes)
- The overall winner of the series will receive a rug and their name of the Jumping NSW Perpetual Trophy which they can keep for 12 months.
- The presentation of the winner will be held at the Summer Showjumping Classic CSI-W in December at The Sydney International Equestrian Centre.

SERIES GUIDELINES:

- The Events will be named "Jumping NSW Amateur of the Year Class".
- They will range from 1.15m to 1.20m first round according to conditions and eg. If indoors 1.10m.
- They will be run as an AM5 238 2.2.
- 6 best horse/rider combination scores will count for each riders series score.
- The first 10 places in each competition will gain points. With the winner of the class gaining 11 points then 2nd 9, 3rd 8 etc down to 10th 1 point.
- Some shows may run the JNSW series class on the final with top 20 horses, please be aware that there may be a qualifying event for these classes that you will have to compete in to be able to compete.

AUSTRALIAN AMATEUR RULING:-

An Amateur is a rider 21 years and over

- who has never competed in a World Cup Qualifier,
- who has never competed in Olympic Games or World Equestrian Games in Showjumping or Eventing
- has not competed in Part 1 or 2 or their equivalent at Sydney, Brisbane, Melbourne, Adelaide or Perth Royal Shows in the past two years.
- Has never competed in a 4 star 3 day event.
- Amateur Riders may not compete in an Amateur class if they compete in a class higher than 1.20m at that show. (effective 1 Jan 2012)
- Amateur Riders may not compete in an Amateur class on a horse that has, or will compete in any class higher than 1.20m at that show. (effective 1 Jan 2012)

RULES OF EVENTS:

A SUPER PHASE has 2 phases that you complete both on regardless on faults in the first phase. If clean in the 1st phase then you go against the clock in the 2nd, if you have rails you still can complete the second phase with no score.

A **TABLE C** speed class is one round against the clock. Faults are penalized by adding to the time taken. Each fenced knocked down is 4 seconds added. A disobedience with knock down or displacing of the obstacle incurs a time correction of 4 seconds. Three disobediences are allowed when the competition is under 1.15m.

A **TOP SCORE** has a certain number of obstacles are set up in the arena, each obstacle carrying points from 10 to 120 according to its difficulty. Obstacles are built so they can be jumped both ways. The athlete is credited with the number of points carried by each obstacle that he has jumped correctly. No points are awarded for an obstacle knocked down. Each athlete has 45 (minimum) to 90 seconds (maximum). During this time, he may jump all the obstacles he wishes in any order and in any direction. Each obstacle may be jumped twice. He may cross the starting line in either direction. Ringing the bell declares the end of the round. The athlete must then cross the finishing line in one direction or the other to allow his time to be recorded.

Joker: An obstacle may be provided as part of the course, duly marked by flags and titled "Joker". The Joker may be jumped twice; 200 points are awarded each time this obstacle is jumped correctly, but if it is knocked down, 200 points must be deducted from the total points obtained so far by the athlete. [OR]

The Joker is not part of the main course. After the fixed time has expired, the bell is rung to end the athlete's round. The athlete must cross the finishing line to have his time recorded he then has 20 seconds in which to attempt the Joker once. Only one attempt at the joker is allowed. Two-hundred points are awarded if this obstacle is jumped correctly, but if it is knocked down 200 points must be deducted from the total points obtained by the athlete.

A **RESCUE RELAY** competition is run under Table C. 2 horse-rider combinations compete as a team. In these Competitions the first Athlete jumps his round and having taken the last obstacle the, next Athlete starts his round and so on. As soon as the Horses' forefeet of his team member jumping the last obstacle have reached the ground, the next Athlete may jump his first obstacle.
