Best in Bega

TODAY is the second day of competition at the Grand Hotel Bega Showjumping Cup.

This year's event has attracted record nominations with over 1400 entries, up 400 more than last year.

Almost 200 riders and their families have been calling Bega home over this past week and are relishing the opportunity to celebrate the festive season with friends and fellow competitors from all over the country.

Day one of competition took place yesterday with 10 events from the 27-event program completed.

Large entries mean long days for not only the riders, but the tireless group of volunteers, officials and Bega Showjumping Club workers.

As to be expected, the day was action-packed with breathtaking talent on show at the Bega Showground.

Today's action begins again at 8am, but the highlight of the event, the Grand Hotel Bega Showjumping Cup Grand Prix event, will take place tonight from 6pm.

Spectators will be treated to the best showjumping that is on offer in this country at the moment.

With the London Olympics next year, many riders are seeking to gain runs on the board to increase their credentials and hopefully make the Olympic squad.

The course will be set by international course designer, Sydney Olympian and Bega favourite Gavin Chester from Sale, Victoria.

Chester is known for his creative flair and setting the scene for very exciting jump-off rounds against

the clock.

This year the Cup has attracted 20 entrants.

There is a great mixture of experience and youth.

The headline act will be well-known Australian Equestrienne Vicki Roycroft, riding her latest imported stallion Kartoon De Breve.

Grant Hughes from Canberra has been competing at Bega for many years but is yet to crack the big one, the Bega Showjumping Cup.

He has placed second on many occasions and hopes that this will be his year.

Hughes' protégé and young Bega rider Clint Beresford finished fourth in last year's event.

Beresford and his mount Belcam Atlantic are last start winners at the Bega Showground when they won the highly regarded grand prix at the Bega Show.

After the past two years, when the event was won by Bega Showjumping Club members Jamie Smith and Sandra Kenny, the local contenders will be favourites to take the title.

Add to that the in-form Brett Clarke and ex-Bega riders Jamie Grant and Emma Smith, it's very likely the cup winner will have a Bega connection again.

All five of these riders competed in the ACT Showjumping Cup the Sunday before Christmas and performed very well, the best being Emma Smith and her huge majestic chestnut stallion Casablanca who placed second.
