THE Bega Show Jumping Club is once again hosting the Fossil's Cup Show Jumping Competition Day on Sunday at the Bega Showground.

Now in its fourth year, the Fossil's Cup has proved to be very popular due to its great prizes and prize money.

It is also highly entertaining each year.

This year the club is offering a massive \$3500 in cash and prizes.

The program has two rings in operation.

Ring 1 starts at 80cm in height and goes up to 1.20m.

Ring 2 starts with cross-rails (approx 30cm) and goes up to 75cm.

Each ring will start at 9am.

All participants must be a member of the Bega Showjumping Club, joining the club can be done on the day.

Entries can also be made on the day or you can take advantage of Global Entries Online and do your entries on the internet.

The feature event of the day, The Fossil's Cup was an event designed for those "older" members who either haven't competed for a while or have never competed at all.

This year, entries for the Fossil's Cup are invitation only with the theme being "the has-beens of local show jumping".

Competitors usually have to borrow a trusty steed and then proceed to negotiate a show jumping

course that has a few tasks including waving to the crowd, weaving in and out of obstacles and dismounting for the judge.

Judges give a mark out of 10 for each task and competitors can lose

points for not clearing the show jumping fences.

It has been very entertaining over the past three years with 80-year-old Leone Creamer winning the event last year.
