### It's back again! The 2010 Fossil's Cup...

It is now the most looked forward to event on the Bega Jump Club calendar; Fossil's Cup Day! This will be the 4<sup>th</sup> year for this popular event which is totally organised and was originally invented by Jackie Curtis. Again, Jackie has excelled herself in collecting sponsorship and has a very generous prize package totaling over \$3,500 in cash and prizes. This year the event will be held on Sunday the 15<sup>th</sup> August which is not that far away. Jackie has already spoken with a lot of members regarding how they can help out on the day as you can see if you read the official program (attached with this newsletter if you haven't already seen it!) Of course we will need ALL hands on deck so if your name isn't down already, make sure you volunteer on the day! The final points of organisation will be discussed at this weeks meeting.

For those who have never experienced the Fossil's Cup before, here is a quick run down. Basically it is just a normal competition day with two arenas, ring one starts at 80cm and goes up and ring two starts with cross-rails and goes up to 75cm. There is a lot of money and prizes to be won. The feature event of the day however, is the Fossil's Cup. The whole show will stop just so that everyone can watch. As the name sort of suggests, competitors in the Fossil's Cup are those who have not ridden or competed on a horse for some time. Last year the winner was 80 year old Leone Creamer from Bermagui who put all of her younger competitors to shame. The fossil's have to negotiate a showjumping course of an appropriate height, and along the way execute tasks that have been prepared. The judges will give the riders a mark out of ten for each task with any faults incurred from the jumping being deducted from the overall score. The tasks are similar to equitation tasks, only more entertaining. In the past the tasks have required riders to wave to the crowd between fences, mount and dismount, negotiate bending pegs and races, ride one handed and collect a bottle of wine at the completion of the course. This year the Fossil's Cup will be different in that it is invitation only. Brett Clarke and Poss Otton have been busily recruiting this year's contestants and the spots are nearly full. I think the theme this year will be the "has been's of local showjumping." This may call for some trickier tasks I think. If you have any suggestions for competitors, tell Brett or Poss ASAP. Please find your Fossil's Cup program attached with this newsletter.

The Southern area consists of the ACT, Bega, Riverina, Young, Goulburn and Monaro Showjumping Clubs. HIS unsolicited warm breath on my checkbone was the prelude to his nose and soft whiskers gently brushing against my earlobe. Slowly, he moved his head closer as I waited for his next move, would he lick me or bite me?

### Global Entries Online...

As promised, here is a quick tutorial on how to use Global Entries Online. Please have a go at using this for all Jump Club days, especially if you are planning to compete at the Fossil's Cup. The first time involves a lot of setting up but after that it gets easy. See how you go.

1. Google 'Global Entries Online'. Go to web site.
2. The home page will invite you to register as a new user or log in as an existing one. Tip: before you do this, there is a drop down menu in the top left hand corner. Change the sport to Equestrian-Showjumping.
3. Select 'Register Now'. You will then have to fill out all of your personal details as well as create a user name and pass word. Make sure you remember these for the next time you want to use Global Entries. The name you enter here is what will be used on your entries. Unfortunately, if you have more than one rider in your family, you will have to register for each of them, which means a different user name for each.
4. When personal details are correct go to the next page which is 'Manage Horses'. It will say that you currently have no horses so you scroll down and begin to fill out the horse details. If your horse is registered with the EA, you should use the registered name as it is usually official events that you will use Global Entries for. The details can always be changed later though. When completed one horse, click submit. If you have more than one horse, repeat until you have finished.
5. When you have entered all of your horses details, go to 'Events' in the in the sub – heading bar. It should say that you have not registered for any events if you are a first time user. If you wish to enter a Bega Showjumping Club event, click on the 'Event Calendar' icon at the top. A list of club's that have events on Global Entries will come up. Scroll down and click on Bega Showjumping Club.
6. A list of Bega Showjumping Clubs events should come up. Click on 'details' next to the event you wish to enter. When the details come up, scroll down to the highlighted 'ENTER THIS EVENT' and click.
7. A program for the event will come up. Place a green tick in the box next to the event that you wish to enter. The cursor will then jump across to "rounds" which has a number in the box. This actually means 'how many horses do you wish to enter in this particular event?' Enter the number of horses you wish to enter and then a drop down list of your horses names will appear for you to select from. Some shows have a limit on the amount of entries that they will accept which is shown on the right hand side. Some shows also have an entries deadline. If you are unable to process an entry, you may have gone over these limitations.
8. Check your entries carefully before submitting. If it was an official event you were entering you would then have to complete the payment section. This is not required for Jump Club. I believe you can go back and change your entries any time before the entries deadline. Hope this helps. If you have any queries, ask Jenny Beresford in the office at Jump Club and she will try to assist.
